BPC/1/2026

Election of Chair and Declaration of Acceptance of Office.

Cllr Billing was proposed and seconded. All were in favour and Cllr Billing was duly elected Chair. Cllr Billing signed the Declaration of Acceptance of Office in the presence of the Clerk.

BPC/2/2026

To receive apologies. No apologies.

BPC/3/2026

Election of Vice Chairman.

Cllr Read was proposed and seconded. All were in favour and Cllr Read was duly elected as vice-chair.

BPC/4/2026

Election of Finance Councillor.

Cllr Root was proposed and seconded. All were in favour and Cllr Root was duly elected as Finance Councillor.

To receive councillors' declarations of acceptance of office or, if not received, to decide when they shall be received. Noted that all councillors had signed the Declaration of Office ahead of the meeting, witnessed by the Clerk.

BPC/7/2026

BPC/8/2026

To note any matters arising from the minutes not included on the agenda for report only. None noted.

BPC/9/2026

To consider applications received for the vacant councillor position and, if appropriate, to resolve to coopt a new member to the Parish Council in accordance with the statutory procedure. An applicant has expressed an interest and will be submitting an application in June 2026. **ACTION:** Clerk to add this item to the June agenda.

BPC/10/2026

Clerk's report circulated separately. Noted.

- Updated Asset Register for 2025–2026, including revised insurance costs, submitted to the insurers, and the updated invoice has been circulated to Councillors.
- Repairs to the play area double gate have been completed, and a new combination lock has been purchased.
- All allotment fees have now been received.
- **BPC/306/2026** - Blisworth Football Club lease: BFC previously confirmed that all amendments had been agreed, they have now reported that the Football Association has raised an issue with the lease. Details are awaited from their solicitors.
- **BPC/289/2026** - An informal meeting between the Parish Council and the Village Hall Trustees is proposed to review the findings and consider whether formal clarification should be sought from the solicitors holding the deeds. A request for information has also been submitted to the Charity Commission. Awaiting possible meeting dates from the Village Hall team.
- **BPC/307/2026** - Three quotes for security shutters have been requested from Blisworth Football Club; none have yet been received, so the S106 grant application cannot progress.
- **BPC/312/2026** – Blisworth Arm planters No quotes received as suppliers have stated that they cannot deliver to the location.
- **BPC/295/2026** – Canal & River Trust were notified of issues with ivy and clearance requested. No response from Canal and River Trust.

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BPC/11/2026

Public Session:

a. Unitary Councillor(s) Report(s).

The new Unitary Councillor for the Hackleton and Roade Ward, Cllr L Weston, introduced herself and outlined her intention to attend future Parish Council meetings.

Cllr Cole noted the forthcoming Council Members' meeting to discuss the results of the Local Plan consultation and confirmed that she will share the outcomes once available. Cllr Cole also reported that no commencement date had yet been provided for the planned chicane on Stoke Road, nor were there any updates regarding the signage for the 20-mph zone/limit.

b. Members of the public.

- (i) A member of the public highlighted ongoing issues with litter at Blisworth Playing Field, particularly following football matches and since the Football Club began serving food. They requested the provision of additional litter bins, including recycling bins, and more frequent emptying of the existing bins.
- (ii) The West Northants Youth Councillor reported that the WNC Youth Council is working with the Finance and Children's Services Directorate to direct additional funding and resources towards youth organisations across the area. West Northants Council (WNC) is promoting a proposal to introduce Youth Mayors for each town within West Northants. This initiative may strengthen youth representation, particularly in Daventry and Brackley, which are geographically farther from Northampton. The outgoing WNC Mayor is championing increased opportunities for young people in rural communities, with a particular focus on ensuring that youth voices are heard and considered in planning matters.

BPC/12/2026

Response to issues raised in the public session.

a. Unitary Councillor(s) Report(s).

Cllrs requested an update from Cllr Cole regarding the proposed Harworth development off Junction 15 (opposite the SEGRO site). Cllr Cole confirmed that Harworth has not amended its development proposals following consultation with surrounding Parish Councils and advised that Blisworth Parish Council should submit any recommended changes directly to the Harworth Group.

Cllrs also requested an update on the proposed Kalvec development off Northampton Road, which remains undetermined. It was noted that Blisworth Parish Council has submitted two objections to the application. National Highways has advised that routing traffic through the village is unsuitable, and Cllrs highlighted the number of serious accidents on Northampton Road caused by poor sight lines and the proximity of the railway bridge. As part of its objection, the Parish Council has requested the installation of a physical central reservation to prevent traffic using Blisworth as a through-route to the M1 or A43.

Cllr Cole confirmed that the Kalvec proposal is not included in the Local Plan and will therefore be determined at committee level.

Regarding vehicle tracking from new developments, Cllr Wilson reported that SEGRO at the Gateway development will be using cameras to monitor vehicle routing to ensure use of Junction 15 rather than local roads. Cllr Cole noted that such camera data is not legally enforceable, but companies may use it to impose sanctions on suppliers. Cllr Cole requested that the agreement with SEGRO be confirmed in writing. **ACTION:** Cllr Wilson to obtain written confirmation via email and copy in Cllr Cole.

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b. Members of the public.

- (i) It was noted that the Council had written to Blisworth Football Club previously to ask that they address the issue of litter. **ACTION:** Cllr Ingram to raise the issue with the Blisworth Village Hall and Playing Field Association. Clerk to write to the Blisworth Football Club again.

BPC/13/2026

Planning and Development.

Application No. 2026/1078/MAF: **Plot** 150 Swan Valley Way Northampton. **Proposal:** Development of 2 no. commercial/ industrial units with ancillary offices, car parking, service areas, soft landscaping and associated infrastructure.

Comments by: Date for comments not confirmed at the time of the meeting.

Discuss Blisworth Parish Directory and agree next steps.

RESOLVED to approve, in principle, funding for the front cover of the updated Blisworth Parish Directory, subject to confirmation of costs. **ACTION:** Costs to be sought.

BPC/15/2026

Correspondence from social media: Update from Cllr Read.

There were no direct messages in the period. The Council's Facebook page reached approximately 12,000 views. The top-performing post was the update on candidates for the West Northants Council (WNC) Unitary Councillor Election. Since the last meeting, further posts have provided additional WNC election information, updates on youth volunteering in the closed cemetery, details of the youth meeting, security information from Northamptonshire Police, and the agenda for the May Annual Parish meeting.

BPC/16/2026

Police & Neighbourhood Watch Scheme: Update from Cllr Read.

A comparison of the 12-month rolling averages for March 2026 and March 2025 shows a 3% reduction in reported crime, alongside an increase in anti-social behaviour incidents. The village continues to benefit from the Northamptonshire Talking neighbourhood alert system, which currently has 78 Blisworth subscribers and provides GDPR-compliant updates on local crime trends and policing priorities. These alerts are also shared via the Parish Council's social media channels. One alert relevant to Blisworth concerned repeated anti-social behaviour in Home Close, where an address was targeted by youths for "knock and run" incidents between 27 September 2025 and 11 April 2026. Residents with information are encouraged to contact Northamptonshire Police on 101, quoting ref 26000207078. Police have also reported progress in the targeted burglary campaign, with a suspect arrested in connection with car-key burglaries across Daventry and South Northamptonshire. The individual, who is not local to the county, has been released on bail with conditions not to enter Northamptonshire. The Police thank the public for their vigilance and encourage residents to review burglary-prevention advice on the Northamptonshire Police website.

The latest newsletter from the Northamptonshire Police, Fire and Crime Commissioner has been published, highlighting work on domestic abuse support for children, fire-service safety courses for young people leaving care, recent road-safety funding allocations, early intervention on anti-social behaviour, and outcomes from the Immediate Justice scheme.

The local PLR update for April and the South Northamptonshire Neighbourhood Policing Team annual update have also been issued; these provide general information and contain no items specific to Blisworth Parish.

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BPC/17/2026

Report on data from SID/VAS devices and Traffic Working Group: Update from Cllr Read and Cllr Brown.

Vehicle Activated Sign (VAS) Report Data from all VAS units for the period 12 April to 9 May (28 days) shows broadly consistent traffic volumes and speed patterns across the village, with slight increases in vehicle movements at all locations compared with the previous month.

On Stoke Road, 76,935 vehicle movements were recorded (average 2,748 per day) within the 20mph zone. Average speed was 20.0mph, with 85% of vehicles at or below 27mph. The highest speed recorded was 76mph.

On Towcester Road, 126,175 vehicle movements were recorded (average 4,506 per day). Average speed was 34.2mph, with 85% of vehicles at or below 41mph. The maximum speed recorded was 91mph, consistent with previous reporting.

On Courteenhall Road, 85,251 vehicle movements were recorded (average 3,045 per day). Average speed was 32.7mph, with 85% of vehicles at or below 41mph. The maximum speed recorded was 104mph, again consistent with earlier data.

On Knock Lane, 79,062 vehicle movements were recorded (average 2,823 per day) in the national speed limit area. Average speed was 47.7mph, with 85% of vehicles at or below 56mph. The maximum speed recorded was 105mph. Traffic volumes show a modest increase on last month, while speeds remain stable.

BPC/18/2026

Discuss consultation on proposed double yellow lines at Pond Bank/Chapel Lane junction and agree next steps. The consultation results indicated that, among those who submitted views, a greater number of residents favoured taking some form of action—such as No Parking signage, double yellow lines, bollards or other measures—than those who expressed a preference for no action.

RESOLVED to install No Parking signage in the first instance and to pursue option with WNC for double yellow lines and bollards. **ACTION:** Cllr Read to obtain quotes for the required signage. Cllr Brown and the Clerk to pursue discussions with WNC.

BPC/19/2026

Report on Youth Parish Council: Update from Cllr Read and Cllr Dallyn.

Two youth meetings were held during the month, each attended by 8–10 young people. The sessions continue to grow in both scope and popularity. Three adults, including the Clerk, are currently progressing through the DBS approval process and will receive appropriate safeguarding training. Engagement with the Northamptonshire Youth Clubs team has provided valuable guidance, and the group is now meeting fortnightly. A games night is planned to help attract additional members.

Based on 2021 Census data, it is estimated that Blisworth Parish has approximately 110 young people aged 11–17. With an average attendance of around 10 participants, the project is currently engaging approximately 9% of the parish's teenage population. Our thanks are recorded to the Minister and the team at the Baptist Church for their continued support of this initiative.

BPC/20/2026

Discuss Blisworth Parish Council newsletter (Round and About) and agree next steps. Update from Cllr Read.

The Council records its sincere thanks to Alan North for his outstanding leadership of the Parish newsletter over many years. His dedication and service to the village are greatly appreciated. Cllr Read and the Minister at the Baptist Chapel have volunteered to take on the role of editors for the parish newsletter,

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Round and About. Access has been obtained to the existing mailbox (blisworthranda@gmail.com), and work is under way to integrate the publication process more formally into the Parish Council's structure. A new email address, newsletter@blisworthparishcouncil.gov.uk will be established in the coming weeks. The intention is to enhance the Parish newsletter by introducing an online edition alongside the traditional hand-delivered version. Residents will be invited to subscribe to the electronic format, which will also be shared via social media with embedded website links to improve reach and engagement and to support contributing organisations. No submissions have yet been received for the next issue; however, contributions are welcomed. **ACTION:** Clerk to review settings for new newsletter email address.

BPC/21/2026

Gateway Update: Update from Cllr Wilson.

The fit-out of Unit 4 has now been completed. Unit 7 has been operational since 5 May 2026, and an increase in traffic is anticipated as a result. It was noted that only one train per day is currently running. Although there are hopes that this may increase to two trains by September, capacity constraints on the main line continue to limit additional rail movements.

These capacity limitations were known at the time the development was approved. Despite these known facts, the site's rail-freight capability was a key factor that enabled the application to bypass local planning processes and be determined directly by the Secretary of State through a Development Consent Order (DCO).

BPC/22/2026

Village Maintenance & Open Spaces.

- a) **Play area: Monthly safety inspection report: Update from Cllr Wilson.** Cllr Wilson completed a visual check and no material concerns were reported. It was noted that, following feedback regarding the difficulty of using the single Yogi Bear litter bin, two additional bins were installed in the play area. Despite this, a significant amount of litter continues to be discarded on the grass within proximity to the new bins. Cllr Wilson removed the rubbish. Noted costs for urgent repairs for double gates at the Play Area (£110.98 No VAT costs).
- b) **Defibrillators: Confirmation of satisfactory checks and any issues.** Update from Cllr Read. Monthly check was undertaken, and no issues were identified. **ACTION:** Clerk to order replacement pads for the unit situated at Blisworth Primary School.
- c) **Allotments (Blisworth Parish Council Allotments, off Courteenhall Road).** Update from Cllr Ingram and Cllr Read. Plot 35 has now been let. Plot 34 remains vacant. All rents have been collected. **ACTION:** Cllr Read to progress through the waiting list and arrange viewings accordingly. Cllr Read and Cllr Ingram to carry out a plot inspection, as last month's inspection could not proceed.
- d) **Closed Cemetery: Update from Cllr Billing. Note Closed Cemetery gravestones and monuments check and agree next steps.** **ACTION:** Cllr Brown to investigate, in liaison with the Church, the appropriate processes and permissions required regarding the potential laying down of three gravestones.
- e) **Street lighting: Update from Cllr Chandler. No update.** **ACTION:** Cllr Chandler to research quotes for installation of solar-powered lights.
- f) **Discuss adoption and refurbishment of BT phone box (High Street, Blisworth) costs and agree next steps.** Discussions are under way with BT Group regarding an agreement that includes a nominal payment of £1. Once this agreement is finalised, the Parish Council will seek planning permission for a

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change of use, to be submitted after BT Group has removed the remaining telephone equipment. Progress is dependent on the outcome of BT Group's current planning application, Planning Consultation: Pay Phone Removal 2026/1209/NRP, which is presently under consideration. **ACTION:** Cllr Read to pursue options and processes to adopt the phone box.

- g) **Discuss feedback on the new noticeboard at the junction of Buttmead** and the bridle path and discuss options for additional replacement noticeboards and agree next steps. The new noticeboard is being well used and is proving effective in keeping notices dry; however, the magnets currently in use are not sufficiently strong. **ACTION:** Clerk to obtain larger magnet strips. Clerk to pursue quotes for replacement noticeboards for other locations in the parish with options to re-site old noticeboards at the parish council allotments.
